The Ox was sad because he was 2nd.




Tiger is a strong swimmer. He was also fast.



He came out just after the Ox. The Jade Emperor said, "The 3rd year is Year of the Tiger."




Rabbit did not swim. He hopped from stone to stone and then to a log and floated.
