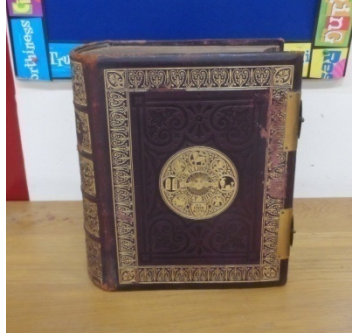
Dear Parents & Carers,

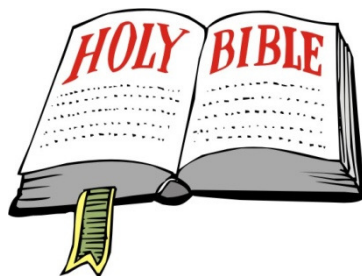
We also hope to have some training for our mid-day meals team before the end of term in leading games at lunchtime to further develop WWO skills.
