




## The March school Choir

This half term **Class 3's topic** has been Scrumdiddlyumptious and it has been truly delicious! To start the half term tasting a variety of breads from around the world; I think brioche was definitely our favourite. We have learned about the journey our food takes before it reaches our shops, about Fair Trade and why it is so import as well as learning about the places Fair Trade farmers live and work by locating these countries and labelling our own maps. In art we have learned about different sketching techniques and have sculpted a piece of fruit out of clay.

As part of our link with Sanctuary in Chichester we have been learning a dance/drama routine with the help of Helen. It has been a wonderful way to explore the journey refugees go through and the children's effort and acting has been superb. We have continued our horn lessons with Mr Wilkonson and have been preparing for our end of term performance.

As a memorable experience we visited the Salon du Chocolat and it was brilliant. We created our own chocolate by choosing our chocolate and fillings as well as designing and making our own chocolate boxes. During our visit we learned about the history of chocolate and how chocolate is made. Visiting a chocolate factory may just be the best visit ever!



### **Yet another busy and exciting term for Year 6!**

The Topic was Blood Heart- a science based one which involved dissecting a heart from MJ Penfold [a superb butcher in Parklands]. Every year, without fail, he donates hearts for the class to dissect. This was followed by Dr Tania and Olli's mother, who is a paramedic, to further discuss the functions of the circulatory system. Did you know that the heart creates enough electricity in a day to power a small electric car for 20 miles?

Hard Knock theatre ran a drama workshop in November that involved acting out scenarios and 'holding the frame'. Later on in the month, the children grouped together to design and create Christmas stalls for the Christmas Fair to raise funds. We raised £208! Year 6 have had lots of music sessions; rehearsing for United Voices, which is being staged at Chichester Festival Theatre on January 16<sup>th</sup>. All the children have worked very hard since September – so relax and enjoy the Christmas holiday!
