Road trip USA




Wk6 :

Investigate totem pole designs by looking at a range of photos and illustrations and find out about the materials and techniques used to make them. Look at common design features and find out what they represent. Design their own totem pole that includes symbols and forms and work alongside a professional artist to carve a class pole.

Note

Children could make individual poles using different-sized card tubes, using a variety of art materials to create symbols and carvings. Encourage the children to think carefully about the symbols they add to their poles. Native American poles often show human, animal and supernatural forms. Totem poles are primarily visual representations of kinship, depicting family crests and clan membership. Common crests include the wolf, eagle, grizzly bear, thunderbird, killer whale, frog, raven, and salmon.
