School Uniform

From discussion at the previous Parents Forum we have decided to look at a new company to provide the uniform. I understand that there have been delays in getting the uniform from the current supplier and that the jumpers are fading, shrinking and cuffs are fraying. We have been in discussion with Game Set and Match a local business that offers better quality, service and competitive price. They will be able to provide all school uniform, coats, book bags and PE kits and are open 7 days a week. We will give you further information on our return when they have finalised the details.

After discussion with the Parents Forum we have taken on board what has been said and suggested by the parents.

Please note the changes to be implemented for September 2016

- We have looked into more substantial book bags which the new company will provide.
- All pupils will now wear pale blue polo shirts or cotton shirts (white will no longer be needed as from September)
- All children will be expected to wear black school shoes no trainers or open toed sandals.
- KS2 pupils asked about ties and we have agreed that they can wear these as from September and will be available from the supplier. It is optional for KS1.
- Grey trousers, skirts, shorts or pinafores to be worn. Summer dresses for girls in the summer term if they wish to.
- White or grey socks/tights only.
- The new supplier can also embroider the surname of your child onto the back of the jumper beneath the collar (surname only) to help jumpers return to owners.
- Simple hair accessories school colours for the girls please.


I look forward to sharing more information from the supplier early next term.
