However, we know that if all children were to return it would be impossible to put in place the necessary measures advised by the Government to ensure the safety and welfare of the children, staff and parents. All decisions around any re-opening are been made with the safety and welfare of the children, staff and parents as our priority.

We know how important it is for children to feel confident about their move to a new class or a new school so we will be planning ways so that ways that they can say goodbye to their current teachers and hello from their new ones. We will send you a letter in a couple of weeks informing you of next year's class teachers and to explain what this will look like.

This will be an evening service for the pupils, parents and staff for presentation of their bibles. We will let you all know the proposed date for this by the end of the term.
