## Remaining funding and money from the second academic year tranche

Funds remaining from 2016-2016 financial year along with funding from the second tranche will be spent on additional swimming instructors to teach alongside class teachers, upskilling them, and all children to be taught in the summer term by a qualified swimming instructor. During the summer term a PE specialist will work with a range of class to develop their athletics skills, up-skill teaching staff in athletics.

During the summer term, there are lots of inter-school competitive and non-competitive events children from all years will participate in.

The school will continue to develop active playtimes and introduce a wider range of activites at playtimes including some inter- house events allowing Sports Leaders and Year 6 children to lead them and continue to develop their leadership skills.

A club will be run for talented children in the school allowing them to develop their skills across a wider range of sports.
