### Dear Parents,

Research has shown that outdoor play is an essential element in helping children to becoming healthier individuals and better learners. Playing outside does not only increase children's fitness levels but also helps children to develop their social skills and increases their ability to use their imagination. Most importantly a break in the fresh air helps children to become better learners as they are able to concentrate more in class and become more focused learners.

It is now school policy that we try as far as possible (weather dependant) to ensure children get fresh air and exercise at playtime and lunchtime. **Children will spend time outdoors even if there is light rain.** 









As we head towards days of typical autumn/winter weather could we ask that all children come to school prepared for the elements. Unless the weather is extremely bad we will be ensuring that children play outside where they are supervised by our experienced staff.

Please ensure that your child comes to school with suitable outdoor wear and footwear. Waterproof jackets and wellington boots should be in school every day.

They will be kept on site in their year group's **purpose-built wellie rack**, **provide by the PTA**. The children's full name and class must be written in both boots. Children will change from their school shoes into their wellington boots when they take their learning outside or the when the field is too wet to go on with school shoes.

#### **Class R News**


