Message from the Local Governing Body

Dear Parents and carers.

As Chair I am writing on behalf of all the Governors of the school firstly to say how proud we are of the staff and our pupils as they come to the end of another school year. The last 2 years have been a real challenge and the school has coped admirably. Thanks, to all the volunteers who help out at the school especially to our vibrant PTA who have organised two really successful events the Christmas and Summer fairs which generated funds for much needed extras to enhance school life for the children.

Unfortunately, there is one area that concerns the Governors and that is unauthorised absences i.e holidays during term time. 50 children have taken holidays during term time this academic year, equating to 352 lost teaching sessions or 10.6% of curriculum learning time. Proposals currently being considered by the Department for Education would see a more stringent approach to unauthorised absences from September. Once the new absence policy has been agreed we will publish it on the school website

Finally all the Governors hope you all have restful summer break and look forward to welcoming the children back to school in September.

Year 4


Year 4 have really enjoyed learning more about the USA. They have learnt about Native Americans such as the Iroquois, their culture, food and beliefs. They have also looked at the different US states, key landmarks and linked their electricity work in science to the topic. Here, children had fun creating simple series circuits and then designed and made a circuit to illuminate a 3d model of the statue of liberty.





Year 5

This term in Year 5 has been all about bugs and beasts! The children found some very interesting minibeasts on their bug hunt around the school grounds, plotting their locations using their Geography mapping skills, including using six-figure grid references. They worked collaboratively to make bug hotels and wrote instructions to help younger children make them too. Class 5 have shown care and leadership as buddies to the new reception children on their visits this term. They enjoyed a visit to Woodhorn Farm and were a credit to the school in their behaviour and the excellent questions they asked of the farmer and herdsman.

rising to the challenges with a positive outlook. It has been a satisfying and amazing finish at The March for us all.










Gardening club and the new willow tunnel
