
<u>Year 5</u> had a fantastic time at Woodhorn Farm in Oving as part of their Allotment topic. They were led on a guided tour by farm manager Richard. They learnt that the cows are milked twice per day and produce 50 Litres of milk each- this equates to 2 million litres of milk per year!

All the milk is organic which means that very few chemicals are used in its production.

Children especially enjoyed the ride on the trailer, the visit to the milking parlour and some very unusual smells!







The School Council members from Yr 4, 5 and 6 led a fantastic assembly for Red Nose Day. They told us about those who benefit from the money raised, both in this country and abroad. We also shared the sporting activities that have been carried by different classes out throughout the day: such as The March Mile relay and the Litter pick challenge. Well done to all for raising a grand total of £130 !!!!



Year 2 took part in Big Sing with other schools in the Goodwood area. They learnt two songs to sing with the others schools and added lots of actions. Each school had learnt their own song to sing to the other schools. We sang Big Big House. It was a really fun morning!





Science day went off with a big bang and the children had lots of fun as well as doing lots of learning. British Science Week was taking place across the country with the theme of scientific journeys. Around the school children were linking science journeys to their topics! There were bee keepers, pollination using cheese puffs and juice boxes, potion and perfume making, marble runs, eggs being floated to test the density of salt and fresh water, the journey of germs with children 'sneezing' across paper!

It was wonderful to hear the children talking about all of the exciting things that had taken place throughout the day. It was particularly special during the afternoon as children spread out across the school working in their house groups. We can't wait until our next Big Science Day which will take place in the summer term to mark the 50 year anniversary of the moon landings.

Year 4 has been transformed into a laboratory of scientific investigations and the magical world of potions! Our journey started with an Alice in Wonderland themed scavenger in which we had to answer riddles to lead us to the next clue. We travelled all over the school grounds and found all the clues! Then there was one last riddle to solve before we enjoyed a tea party complete with jam tarts and cake. It was a brilliant way to start our new topic.

In our art lessons we observed perfume bottles and then designed our own bottles that could be used for perfume or potions. We then made our own bottles out of clay...we hope they don't leak! It has been so fun to learn about the scientific properties of potions, including learning about solids, liquid and gases; and the chemical reactions that occur when these are mixed. We inflated balloon with vinegar and baking soda, saw cabbage juice change colour and became Tudor apothecaries, physicians and herb-women to find out about how potions were used in the past. The smell from our classroom invaded the school with cabbage and vinegar one day but it smelled beautiful when we made Tudor pomanders.

As well as our amazing topic we have continued to learn the cello and can't wait for our performance. This half term we enjoyed World Book Day and Big Science Day. We have also started rehearsals for our Easter play. It has been such a fun topic, we almost wish we could create a potion to make it last even longer!





Year 3 enjoyed a wonderful workshop by Paul Ulson on survival during the Stone Age. We learnt about the beginning of hunting and gathering, what people ate, wore and how they kept warm. All finished off with a chance to have a go at our own cave painting a sketch some real artefacts - a wonderful day with lots of fantastic history!



#### Year 3 Butser Ancient Farm

Monday 4<sup>th</sup> March saw Year 3 visit Butser Ancient Farm as part of their Tribal Tales topic. The children got a first-hand experience in what life was like in the Iron Age. They made jewellery, took part in archaeology and created chalk carvings. Despite the heaviest of downpours during our archaeological dig, we had a wonderful day and gained a real insight into what life was life all those years ago.





#### **Reception Rabbits!**

What a wonderful start to the Spring Term for Reception Class; we adopted two baby rabbits for our Stunning Start. Peter and Benji have settled in well now and feel quite at home roaming the classroom. It has given the children many opportunities for different types of writing from creating little books about the adventures of the rabbits to creating WANTED posters for the escaped rabbits.

As you may have heard, one night Peter and Benji made a bid for freedom and I was greeted the following morning to the soft toys scattered about, a lot of rabbit's presents and some of the children's work being nibbled! Little did we know how apt the title for our topic would be – 'The Rabbit Problem'!



Of course many of the children throughout the school are delighted with our new pets and we are aiming to 'train' them to become our 'Reading Rabbits' to encourage and develop confidence in our children.

The Reception children are very pleased that we are back at Forest School again. Last week the children made Easter crosses by using lashing and tying techniques which help to develop their fine motor skills and patience!


